## First Aid Kits

Each team is provided with a league issued first aid kit. Additional first aid kits and first aid supplies are available on site at the Trails Snack Shack. A First Aid Kit is required at all team practices and games.

## Inspection of Playing Equipment

- This Little League requires regular inspection of playing equipment.
- Unsafe equipment should not be given in team equipment bags.
- Managers and Coaches are required to inspect equipment prior to each use.
- Bad equipment will be removed from the game prior to official start time.

## Bat Safety

In Little League, swinging bats in the dugout is prohibited, and there is no “on-deck” position. Players are not allowed to swing bats while in the dugout. Bats should be kept against the dugout fence or in a bat holder, and players should not handle bats until it's their turn to bat. This rule is primarily for safety reasons. If a player is holding a bat, the player **MUST** be wearing a helmet.

## Accident Reporting Procedure

- **What to Report:** An incident that causes a Player, Manager, Coach or Umpire to receive medical treatment or first aid must be reported to The Safety Officer and/or League President.
- **When to Report:** All such incidents described above must be reported to The Safety Officer within 24 to 48 hours of the incident.

- **How to Make a Report:** Reporting incidents can come in a variety of forms. Most typically they are telephone conversations, text messages, or email. At a minimum, the following information is needed.

1. The name and address of the injured person.
2. The date, time, and location of the incident.
3. As detailed of a description of the incident as possible.
4. The preliminary estimation of the extent of the injury.
5. The name and phone number of the person making the report.
6. Names and phone number of any witnesses.

Collect as much information as possible in regards to the accident. Then a call is to be made to The Safety Officer, reporting the incident within 48 hours. Little League insurance is a supplemental insurance to the insured's own insurance. There is a small deductible.
